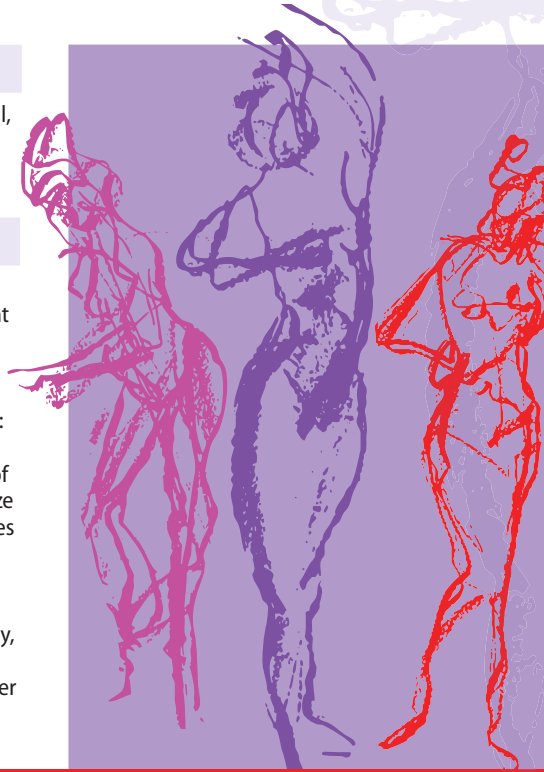


TARGET AUDIENCE
